OLD BUSINESS:

Members were allowed to review the minutes from the August 2025 meeting.

Motion: Assistant Chief Robinson moved to accept the minutes, which were seconded by Director Lane. The minutes of the August 2025 meetings were approved.

NEW BUSINESS

Budget Update

Mike Fraser updated the council members on the current budget position.

- The second semi-annual and year-end reports for FY 24-25 were submitted before the deadline and accepted by FDLE.
- At the time of the meeting, the budget had a favorable position of \$7412.31 for training courses.

Commission Updates

Director Hartman presented the updates from the CJSTC Commission meeting held on October 27-30, 2025.

- FEMA's independent study program is currently down due to the government shutdown. FDLE has sent out a comparable program from LSU that can be used; however, new officers must take the FEMA 100 and 700 classes once they become available.
- FDLE has requested that the trust fund allotment per officer be restored to \$80 per officer for FY26-27.
- HB83 has been filed regarding the presence of children during warrant services. It is proposed that the parent or guardian are asked specific questions about the safety and care of their child after they are arrested. If it is determined that the child has no one to care for them, additional steps must be taken to ensure the child's safety and well-being.
- HB229 has been filed, fining law enforcement agencies that do not adhere to state-required duties related to supporting immigration enforcement. Additional clarification on this bill has been requested.
- FDLE has begun teaching the new CJSTC rifle instructor course around the state. There have been a surprising number of failures, which have raised many questions regarding the course. This course is not mandatory. Agencies are allowed to develop their own rifle training courses but must shoot the FDLE qualification course every two years (Form 86). FDLE handgun instructors who have also taken an agency-approved rifle instructor class are allowed to sign off on Form 86s.
- Intoxilizer 9000: Revised courses are scheduled for rollout December 2025. The DOT grant program was awarded AI and BTO courses, which will allow the trust fund to save training dollars on these classes.
- CJSTC Form 67s default to salary incentive for advanced classes. If an officer NEEDS the class to count for mandatory retraining, they must communicate this to the agency or training center.
- Out-of-state EOTs need to take mandatory online retraining on the FDLE website. FPSI encourages this be done before they begin the EOT program.

Academy Updates

- FPSI has completed most of the gym renovation, and it is open for use.

Region III Minutes

- Director Hartman will sign the final documents to begin construction of the new “hotel-style” facility, which will be built adjacent to the new dorms.
- Construction on the high-speed track is underway.
- Survival Flight will soon begin construction on its new hangar and barracks, which will be built adjacent to the existing helicopter pads.
